

What a Thrill! Incredible Whirlpools Viewed From 45 Meters Above the Sea

From the 450 meter-long pathway built in the girder space of Onaruto Bridge, experience Naruto Strait, home to one of the three largest currents in the world and some of the largest whirlpools in the world. With guided tours and four glass floors along the way offering views of the whirlpools below from a height of 45 meters, this thrill-packed spot makes you feel as though you'll be sucked into the sea. There are also viewing boats available that let you see these powerful whirlpools right before your eyes.

Dozens of earth pillars in a row make onlookers marvel at the mysteries of nature, wondering how such a curious sight came to be. The view from the top and nighttime illuminations are also worth seeing. 
The nostalgic, tranquil atmosphere wrought by the stately white-walled buildings featuring udatsu, short pillars set on beams, transforms when the sun sets and square lanterns lining the streets light up, their warm and gentle glow transporting you to an entirely different world from the daytime. With guides available to give in-depth explanations of the history Wakimachi and Aigura, which houses shops that sell indigo products and other souvenirs as well as a café area, there's plenty here to entertain visitors.

The Symphony of the Magnificent Yoshino River and the Rock Garden of Honraku-ji Temple

This stunning rock garden incorporates the natural scenery of the surrounding Asan Mountains and the Yoshino River, with crane rocks and turtle rocks swimming and boat rocks sailing toward Horaijima Island. The cranes and turtles represent longevity, making this a traditional Japanese Horai garden for immortality, with high-quality installations arranged to keep the viewer engaged. The garden was created by Tadakazu Saito.

10 A Townscape of Two-Tiered Udatsu Pillars

Until the mid-1950s, this was a flourishing townscape, home to merchants wealthy from tobacco and raw silk who vied with each other to build of udatsu (short pillars). The udatsu here are unusual compared to others in Japan in that they are two-tiered, with the first half lower than the second. and feature incredible plasterwork of pine trees, hawks, turtles, and more. There are guided town tours as well as Orimotoya, an exemplary building that has retained the appearance of its old udatsu since the Edo Period, which was rebuilt during the early Meiji era as a merchant house for a sake brewer, and is now used as a place for relaxation as well.

Roughly an hour's drive from the national highway awaits an unobstructed, awe-inspiring panoramic view overlooking the Yoshino River, Tokushima Expressway, and the Asan Mountains. The Mizunomaru area of Mizunomaru Fureai Park takes advantage of its high altitude with multiple paraglider flight points. Sit on the gentle slopes at the top of the mountain and spend your time watching paragliders glide through the air.

Sunlight pours through the trees onto the crystal clear waters of this gorge, over which hang Niju Kazura Bashi, a pair of vine bridges that make you feel as though you're venturing into uncharted territory. Feel the thrill as you cross one of the vine bridges, or descend to the blue stone-laden river below to admire the beauty of the gorge. For even more fun, try crossing the gorge in a human-powered

ropeway called a yaen.



Oku-lya Double Vine Bridges

The distinctive terrain of the Shikoku Mountains, formed as the oceanic plate sank below the continental plate in the Nankai Trough off the coast of Shikoku, makes for a powerful sight visible from the Yoshino River. Behold steep cliffs and curious rock formations approaching your boat as the captain provides riveting commentary. Experiencing the crystal clear waters of the Yoshino River is another part of the charm of this boat tour.

Located in the only village in Tokushima Prefecture is Okawara Highland, offering sweeping views of the Shikoku terrain, including the Kii Channel, Tokushima Plains, and Asan Mountains. Over 30,000 colorful hydrangeas blooming from late June to mid-July make this landscape all the more spectacular. There is a telescope in Hilltop House, a popular spot for stargazing parties, and locally grown produce and processed goods for sale in the summer. This area is also where the brand-name Okawara Highland cattle graze, for added charm.



Connecting Tairyu-ji Temple, the 21st temple on the Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage, from its 600-meter altitude to the foothills is the longest ropeway in Japan, offering sweeping views of the Naka River, Tsurugi Mountains, and Kii Channel. Ropeway crew provide amusing commentary and anecdotes about Kobo Daishi, letting you enjoy the scenery below on an even deeper level. This high, shaking ropeway is also perfect for thrill-seekers.

The silhouette of the mountains over a tranquil town from the slightly elevated main hall resembles Kobo Daishi in repose, making for a truly Japanese landscape. At Byodo-ji Temple, the 22nd temple along the Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage, you'll find this serene space that evokes the essence of the Japanese mind, where a rope connects from the seated statue of the Yakushi Nyorai at Niomon Gate, and in the main hall you can see Daishi with the rope in his hand.

From the promenade overlooking the temple town you can see the main temple of Yakuo-ji and a town woven with streets so narrow cars cannot pass. Go a bit further to take in views of Ohama Beach, famous as a sea turtle spawning ground.





Situated in the east of Shikoku Karst at an altitude of 1,300 meters is Tengusou, where, with no ambient light around, you can see the starry skies throughout the seasons. The number of stars in the night sky will astonish you. When conditions are good, you may even see Gamma Crucis (the top star) of the constellation Crux, visible only in the south of Southern Kyushu. With no manmade objects obstructing the view, you can enjoy the scenery from your guest room or from the baths. There are also telescopes, hammocks, benches with heaters built so you can observe the heavens, along with nightly guides to the starry skies so you can enjoy the view even more.

From the Mt. 

The ruins of Besshi Copper Mine, part of Japan's modernization, and its surrounding mining town emerges out of the blue atop a mountain 750 meters high.
